

SECTION ONE

K. C. Das Commerce College

A SHORT PROFILE

LOCATION:

K. C. Das Commerce College is a well-known institute of commerce education in the North-East. It is located within the Guwahati city at a distance of 37 kms from the Gopinath Bordoloi Airport, Barjhar, Guwahati and 3 kms from the Guwahati Railway Station.

THE BEGINNING:

The college was established on the 7th day of November, 1983. The untiring efforts of a group of eminent educationists and free thinkers who felt the necessity to establish the second Commerce College in Guwahati gave birth to K. C. Das Commerce College. The college was instituted with the financial assistance provided by Shri Ramesh Chandra Chaudhury and the college has been named in the cherished memory of his father Late Keshab Chandra Das, an educationist of repute who was Inspector of Schools, Assam in the 1930's.

Initially the college started in the evening shift with one hundred and seven students in the premises of Sonaram H.S. & Multipurpose School, Bharalumukh, Guwahati. On the 30th of Nov. 1994, the college was shifted to its permanent site at Chatribari, Guwahati - 781008.

The college came under the deficit-grants-in-aid system in the year 1998.

FUNCTIONING: HAND IN HAND WITH 21st CENTURY

At present it has nine departments, viz-Accountancy, Management, Finance, Economics, Mathematics and Statistics, English, Assamese, Hindi, and Bengali and it imparts education to more than eighteen hundred students with an efficient and dedicated teaching staff, whose endeavour is to direct students to become motivated life-long learners and decision-makers. More than eight hundred students are admitted annually. Since its establishment, the college has come a long way in meeting the emerging needs and challenges of the present day scenario.

INFRUSTRUCTURE:

At present, we have provided the infrustructure consisting of airy and spacious classrooms, a library—which has a fair collection of books on wide ranging subjects. The library regularly subscribes to a number of magazines and periodicals, daily news papers, and national and international journals. Reference section, Magazine, News Paper section with 'Reading Corners' are also available to ensure that the students realise their true potential and grow up to become complete individuals and responsible citizens.

The college has a well developed computer centre so that the students will be fully equipped to deal with any aspect of computer. Incorporation of computer aided learning and internet connection has aided a new dimension to the teaching process.

However, the full-fledged structure as per architectural planning will be available within a very short time because we intend to provide more facilities including 'Digital Library' which will be the first one of this kind in North Eastern region.

VISION OF THE COLLEGE

K. C. Das Commerce College envisages to be the premier institute to impart good quality commerce education in the North-East of the country. It aspires to be recognised for its quality teaching to a diverse student population so as to enable them to realise and develop their inherent and potential capabilities. We aim to expand the employability of our students.

THE COLLEGE EMBLEM



The College Emblem holds a significant meaning. The "Diya" or the "Lamp" at the centre is symbolic of the light of knowledge which, like the rays of the sun radiates hope into the lives of man.

"Knowledge is Power" and the "Open Book" below speaks of learning and the quest for knowledge which is the primary pre-occupation of the institute.

Just above the lamp, is an inscription— "Abirabirma edhi", which is a part of a Sanskrit sloka taken from 'Aitareya Upanisada'. This sloka is an invocation to 'the supreme soul' to lead man towards knowledge. The above extract is an invocation to the same 'supreme soul' to enlighten the mind of man. Simplifying this, it means elimination of the darkness of ignorance by the light of knowledge.

The central ensemble is surrounded by a circular band on which is inscribed the name of the college in both Assamese and English language. The entire emblem stands on an arc which mentions the date of establishment of the college.

THE MOTTO OF THE COLLEGE

Students from other colleges seeking admission in the B. Com. Part-I of K.C. Das Commerce College will have to do a compulsory certificate course in computers to be conducted by the college in collaboration with a reputed Computer Institute recognised by the Govt. of India. Students will be categorised into four groups based on their previous knowledge about computers and its application.

Various rules relating to B. Com. Part-I, Part-II and Part-III Examinations have been stated under the following headings.

RULES AND REGULATION FOR B.COM. PART II AND PART III EXAMINATION

1. REQUIREMENT OF PASS MARKS

a) A student shall be declared to have passed the Part-I examination provided he/she secures 33% marks in aggregate out of 600; and a minimum of 25% marks out of 100 in each paper.

- b) A student shall be declared to have passed the Part-II examination provided he/she secures 33% marks in aggregate out of 800; and a minimum of 25% marks out of 100 in each paper.
- c) A student shall be declared to have passed the Part-III examination provided he/she secures 33% marks in aggregate out of 400; and a minimum of 25% marks out of 100 in each paper for General Course.
- d) A student opting for Major in the Part-III examination shall be declared to have passed the examination provided he/she secures a minimum of 33% marks in aggregate out of 700; and a minimum of 25% marks out of 100 in each paper.
- e) In order to pass B. Com. a candiate shall be required to secure minimum 25% marks in each paper and an aggregate of 33% marks in Part-I, Part-II and Part-III B. Com. Courses respectively.

2. RULES FOR THE CANDIDATES OFFERING TO APPEAR IN ARREAR SUBJECTS AND PART-I & II OR PART-II & III SIMULTANEOUSLY

- a) If a candiate fails to pass or present himself/herself in not more than one paper (henceforth to be called arrear subject) in the Part-I examination, he/she may be allowed to sit for the arrear paper at the next Part-I examination held by the University.
- b) A candidate having arrear in Part-I examination or having failed in Part-I examination shall have the option to appear in the Part-I and Part-II examinations simultaneously.
- c) If a candidate fails to pass or present himself/herself in not more than one paper (henceforth called the arrear subject) in Part-II examination, he/she may be allowed to sit for the arrear paper at the next Part-II examination held by the University.
- d) A candidate having arrear in Part-II examination or having failed in Part-II examination shall have the option to appear in the Part-II and Part-III examination simultaneously. A candidate having failed in Part-I or having arrear in Part-I examination shall be allowed to prosecute studies in Part-III course, but shall not be allowed to appear in the Part-III examination. If a candidate fails to pass the arrear paper of Part-II but passes the Part-III examination, his/her results of the Part-III examination shall be kept in abeyance till he/she clears the arrear paper as per the provision of regulation.
- e) A candiate having arrear subject may also appear in all the paper of his/her Part-I/II examination if he/she so desires.
- f) If a candidate obtains pass marks in the arrear paper, he/she will be deemed to have passed the Part-I/II examination as a whole.
- g) A candidate must pass the Part-I, Part-II and Part-III examination within three years of completion of Part-III course. In each part maximum of three chances each will be available for a candidate subject to the conditions laid down above.

3. RULES FOR ABSENTEE AND UNSUCCESSFUL CANDIDATES OF PART-I, PART-II & PART-III EXAMINATION (S) OF THE UNIVERSITY.

A) If a student after completion of a regular course of study and after being duly sent up could not appear at or pass the B. Com. Part-I, Part-II & Part-III examinations (both Major and General), he/she may appear as a non-collegiate candidate at any of the successive examinations immediately following the original one without attending classes subject to clause 2 above.

Provided that (i) the Principal certifies to his/her good conduct and satisfactory progress of studies during the intervening period and that (ii) the student offering subjects with practical shall be required to attend at least 20% practical classes in an Elective subject and 40% in a Major subject.

4. RULES FOR REPETITION OF PAPERS OF PART-I/II EXAMINATIONS

Successful candidates of Part-I/Part-II examination of this University may be allowed to repeat any one of the papers of Part-I/Part-II Course not involving practicals or any of the theory papers of the Part-I/II Course involving practicals in the succeeding Part-I/Part-II examination in order to improve their performances. The earlier marks secured in the practical part and the remaining theory paper(s) of the examination in the relevant cases will be carried over. In the interest of students the better of the two marks secured in the paper repeated will be considered for computation of his/her Part-I/II result. Such candidates will be eligible to sit for the repeat paper along with his/her Part-I/II/III examination.

Provided that a candidate who passed Part-I/II examination with arrear subject(s) shall not be eligible to sit for repeating any paper.

5. RULES FOR DECLARATION OF RESULTS

- a) A candidate who passes Part-I, Part-II and Part-III examinations, shall be declared to have passed the B. Com. examination as a whole and shall be eligible for the Degree of Bachelor of Commerce (B. Com.)
- b) For General Course the result will be determined out of 1700 marks and will be declared as follows:

First Division

1020 Marks and above

Second Division

Between 680 and 1019 marks.

Simple Pass

Between 567 and 679 marks.

c) For Major Course the results will be determined out of 1400 marks of first, second and third year classes and will be declared as follows:

First Class

840 Marks and above

Second Class

Between 560 and 839 marks

Simple Pass

Between 462 and 559 marks.

ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS

• For Higher Secondary (Two year) Course

To be eligible for admission into the Higher Secondary first year class of Commerce, a student has to pass the H.S.L.C. EXamination of SEBA or any other equivalent examination recognised by the Assam Higher Secondary Education Council (AHSEC).

• For B. Com. (Three year Degree) Course

To be eligible for admission into the first year of B. Com. a student has to pass the

(i) Pre-University/Pre-Degree/Higher Secondary Examination in Commerce or equivalent examination in Commerce.

Or

(ii) P.U./P.D./H.S. Examination in Arts with Book Keeping and Accountancy (BKA) and Business Organisation and Commercial Practice (BOCP).

(iii) P.U./P.D./H.S. Examination in Science and Arts provided BKA and BOCP papers are cleared in the First Year and Final Year H.S. Examination of the AHSEC before appearing the B. Com. Part-I Examination.

MIGRATION AND ELIGIBILITY CERTIFICATE

Students from Boards or Universities other than SEBA, AHSEC and Gauhati University shall have to produce a Migration Certificate at the time of admission. They must also obtain an Eligibility Certificate from the AHSEC and G.U.

For admission in H. S. course a student has to pay a fee of Rs. 100/- to AHSEC to obtain the Eligibility Certificate. For admission in B. Com. course a student from other Boards of Assam (other than AHSEC) has to pay a fee of Rs. 600/- and a student of other Boards from outside Assam has to pay a fee of Rs. 1000/- to G.U. to obtain the same.

ADMISSION PROCEDURE

Application for admission into the college should be made in the prescribed application form issued by the college office on payment of Rs. 100/-.

Admission to the H.S. Course is held after the announcement of the H.S.L.C. Examination result and to the B. Com. Course after the H.S. Final Examination result.

The dates of admission to various classes are notified in the local newspaper and the College Notice Board.

Admission to the college is made strictly in order of merit and is governed by the college admission rules. There is reservation for SC, ST, OBC/MOBC, physically handicapped students and for students excelling in extra curricular activities as shown below.

All admissions made to the college are provisional and subject to the approval of the AHSEC/GU. The college is not responsible if the AHSEC/GU does not approve the admission of any student on ground of lack of Migration Certificate/Eligibility Certificate or for furnishing wrong or false documents and statements. Students shall have to produce original Marksheets, Certificates etc, at the time of admission. Attested copies of the same are to be attached with the application forms.

CAPITATION FEES

A few seats are reserved at the time of admission to be filled up against the payment of "Capitation Fees".

RULES REGARDING COLLEGE INTERNAL EXAMINATION

Periodical Unit Tests are held instead of Preparatory or Test or Annual examination. There will be two unit tests for H.S. 1st yr, H.S. 2nd yr, T.D.C. 1st yr and T.D.C. 2nd yr students. However, for the T.D.C. 3rd yr students, there will be no unit tests; only home assignments will be given to them.

IMPORTANT NOTE:

- No student will be allowed to appear in the final examination if he/she is unable to secure
 30% marks in aggregate in the Unit Tests of the College.
- The H.S. first Year Examination is conducted by the Assam Higher Secondary Education Council.

REPORT CARD SYSTEM

Report Cards are issued to the students of the college after every internal examination. The total number of classes attended by the students will be indicated in the Report Card.

CASUAL ADMISSION

Admission for casual students will start from 1st October 2005 to 7th of October 2005.

 - (v) Short Salwars with short-sleeve as uniform for the girls are not allowed.
 - (vi) Jeans Pants are not allowed as uniform.

CLASS ATTENDANCE

A student is expected to attend atleast 75% of the total lectures delivered.

(a) Students of T.D.C. and H.S. classes attending less than 75% but more than 50% of the classes shall be treated as "Non-Collegiate" and will be liable to pay a fine of Rs. 65.00 (Sixty five only) & Rs. 30/- (Thirty only) respectively.

- (b) Students attending less than 50% but more than 25% of the classes will be considered and allowed to appear in the examination provided he/she pays a fine of Rs. 1000/- (one thousand).
- (c) Students attending less than 25% of the total classes will be declared as 'Discollegiate' and will not be allowed to appear in the Annual/Final Examinations.

IMPORTANT NOTE

The students admited to the college must abide by all such rules and regulations as prescribed by the college authorities. Violation of rules, unsatisfactory progress, irregular attendance, showing discourtesy to the teachers and staff membrs in any form, adoption of unfair means during examination etc. are some of the offences which may make students liable for disciplinary action like termination of scholarship, forced transfer and even expulsion from the college.

All powers for maintaining discipline are vested with the Principal and his decision shall be final in all such matters.

IMPORTANT NOTE FOR GUARDIANS AND STUDENTS

- No student will be allowed to appear in the final examination if he / she is unable to secure
 30% marks in aggregate in the unit tests of the college.
- Report Cards issued after every exam must be duly signed by the guardians before returning
 it to the "Examination Committee" of the college. If any student is found guilty of forging
 guardian's signature, severe disciplinary action will be taken against the student.
- Students attending less than 50% but more than 25% of the classes will be considered and allowed to appear in the final examination provided he / she pays a fine of Rs. 1000/- (one thousand).
- Students attending less than 25% of the total classes will be declared as "Discollegiate" and will not be allowed to appear in the final examination.
- College Uniform is strictly compulsory. It is also mandatory for the students to always bring the identity card to college.
- It is compulsory for all guardians to attend "Guardians' Meet" regularly which will be held periodically in the college. The respective dates are specified in the college "Academic Calendar."
