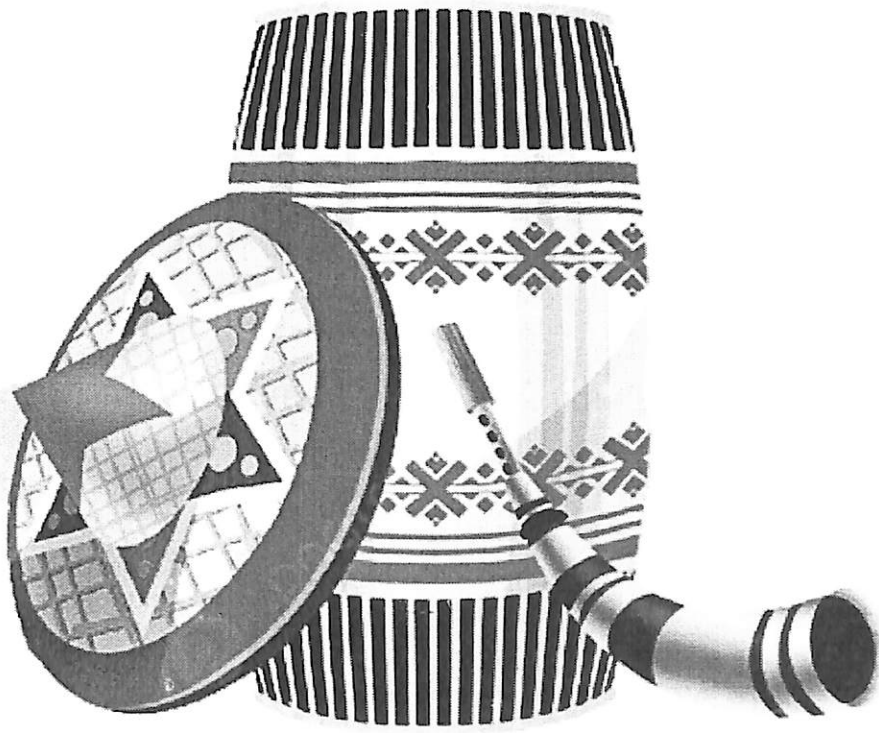

বৰপেটা সত্ৰ অসমৰ এখন সবাতোকৈ কাষীপুৰী দ্বাৰকা নগৰ হিচাপে পৰিচিত সত্ৰ। অসমৰ বৰপেটা জিলাত এই সত্ৰ অৱস্থিত। এই সত্ৰৰ প্ৰতিষ্ঠাপক আছিল মহাপুৰুষ শ্ৰীশ্ৰী মাধৱদেৱ। এই সত্ৰ স্থাপন কৰা হৈছিল ১৫০৫ শকাব্দত। এই সত্ৰৰ পূৰ্বতে নাম আছিল বৰপেটা থান। যেতিয়া মাধৱদেৱে সত্ৰ ত্যাগ কৰিছিল, তেওঁ এই সত্ৰৰ দায়িত্ব সমূহ তেখেতৰ এগৰাকী অনুগামী শ্ৰীমথুৰা দাস বুঢ়া আতাক দি গৈছিল। মথুৰা দাস সেই সময়ৰ বৰপেটা সত্ৰৰ প্ৰথম সত্ৰীয়া আছিল।

বৰপেটা সত্ৰৰ পৰিসৰৰ আৰম্ভণি হয় তিনি বাটচৰাৰে। এই সত্ৰত তিনিখন জপনা আছে। এই জপনাসমূহ সত্ৰৰ উত্তৰ, দক্ষিণ আৰু পশ্চিম দিশত অৱস্থিত।

কীৰ্তন ঘৰ এই সত্ৰৰ মাজভাগত অৱস্থিত। এই সত্ৰৰ মুখ্য দ্বাৰ পশ্চিম দিশত অৱস্থিত। মুখ্য পশ্চিম জপনাৰ সন্মুখত দুটি কাঠৰ স্তম্ভ (পুৰণি নাম তুলসী খুটা) আছে যি দুটা স্তম্ভই মুখ্য ভৱনক, ধৰি ৰাখিছে। ইয়াত তিনিটা গুৰু আসন ৰাখি থোৱা আছে। বহুত মানুহৰ এইটো ধাৰণা যে

এই আসনসমূহ শ্ৰীমন্ত শঙ্কৰদেৱ, শ্ৰীশ্ৰীমাধৱদেৱ আৰু পদ্ম আতাৰ লগত জড়িত। বহুত মানুহৰ এইটো এটা বিশ্বাস আছে যে এই আসনসমূহ ভগৱান শ্ৰী কৃষ্ণক সমৰ্পিত কৰাৰ বাবে ৰখা হৈছিল। গুৰু আসনসমূহৰ আগত সাতখন ডাঙৰ শৰাই এশাৰীকৈ ৰাখি থৈছে। প্ৰত্যেকখন শৰাইৰ আগফালে এটা চাকি জ্বলাই ৰখা হয়। কীৰ্তন ঘৰত কোনো দেৱ বা দেৱীৰ মূৰ্তি ৰখা নহয়।

সত্ৰত এটি 'ভাজ ঘৰ' আছে। এই ভাজ ঘৰ কীৰ্তন ঘৰৰ উত্তৰ-দক্ষিণ ঠাইত অৱস্থিত। ভাজ ঘৰত বিভিন্ন ধৰণৰ মূল্যবান গহনাসমূহ ৰাখি থোৱা যায়।

এই সত্ৰত পাত চাং নামৰ এবিধ টিং আৰু কাঠেৰে সজা গৃহ আছে যি পূৱত অৱস্থিত। পাত চাঙত ধৰ্মীয় আৰু প্ৰশাসনীয় বিষয়সমূহ আলোচনা কৰা যায়।

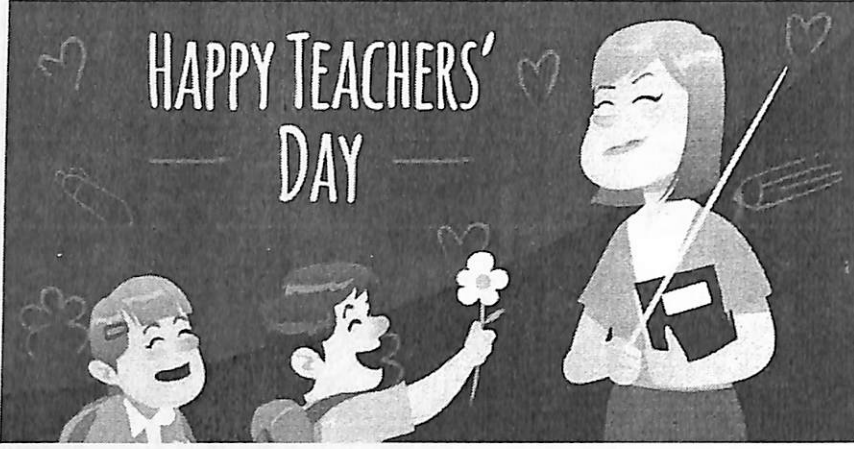

contradiction, enabling individuals to utilize technological innovation in the right way.

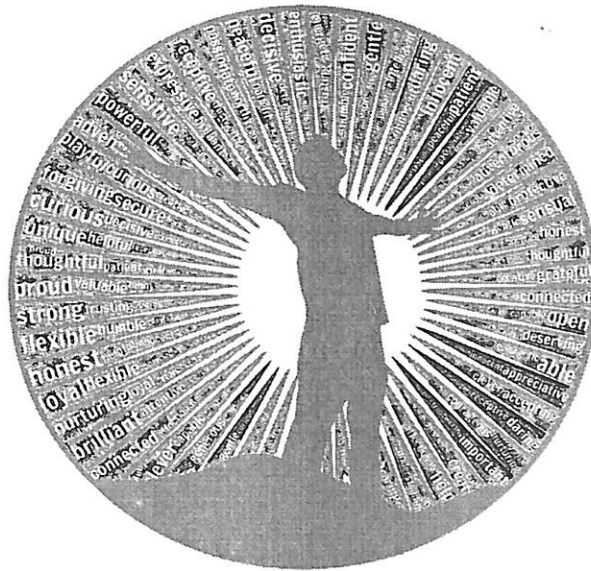

***I can vouch this idea holds more pros than cons. I think This is one of the best ideas to implement.***

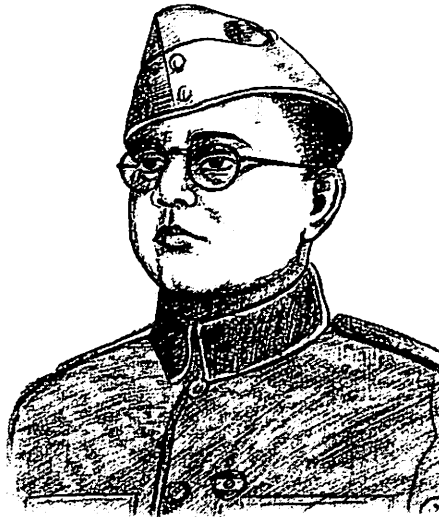

Subhash Chandra Bose was born on 23 Jan 1897. He was a The great freedom fighter who served India as a valiant warrior & raised the first Indian National Army (INA), Azad Hind Fauj and adopted the slogan "Jai Hind" coined by Shenbagaraman Pillai for INA. He is India's greatest freedom fighter who dared to challenge the British Raj alongside his fellow citizens.



## 2. "POWER OF LAW AND JUSTICE"

He says that always stand against the injustice because the greatest crime is to compromise with what you believe is wrong. He urged people to always stand by the right no matter how tough it is because he believed that you get what you give. So at present if you aren't standing against the wrong

then in future that wrong may also happen to you ,hence always try giving out the best.

## 3. FREEDOM IS TAKEN, NOT GIVEN"

Bose was the true hero of India who helped us gain independence from the British. Such iconic people fought selflessly not only for themselves but for the generations ahead. ## 1. "NO REAL CHANGE IN HISTORY HAS EVER BEEN ACHIEVED BY DISCUSSIONS."

Discussion can never lead to victories, change needs work and work need efforts. 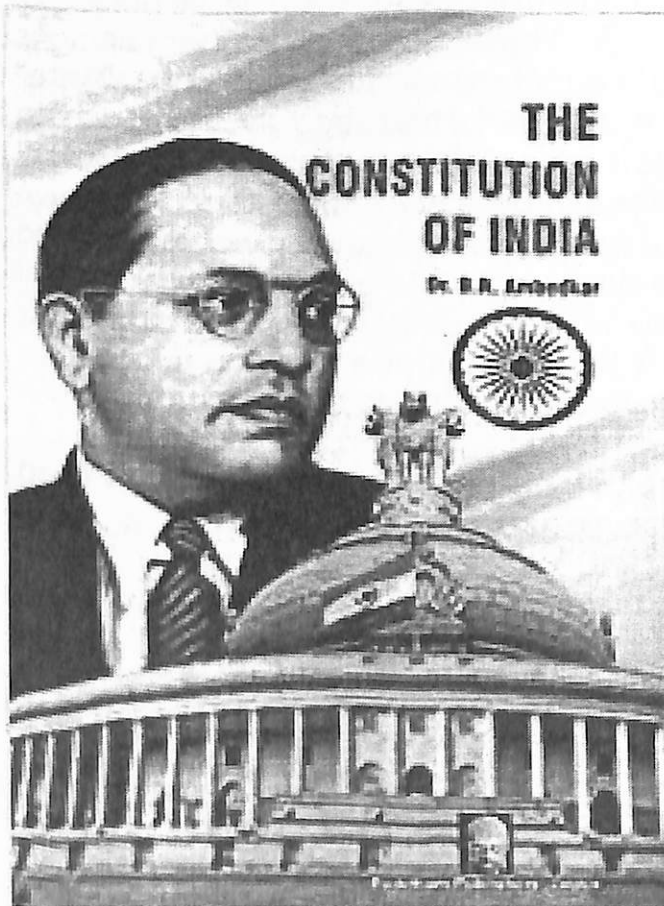

# *The constitution of India and Dr. B.R. Ambedhkar*

**T**he Father of Indian Constitution once said 'The Constitution of India is not a mere lawyer's document it is a vehicle of life, its spirit is always the spirit of ages.'

The Constitution of India is the supreme document of the Country, the Law of the Land, the source of all rights and duties of the Citizens of the Country, although a few of them applies to the non-citizens also.

A Constituent Assembly was formed on November 1946 to frame the Indian Constitution under the scheme formulated by the Cabinet Mission Plan. The formulation of an independent and sovereign Constitution by the people of India is by far the biggest achievement of India's Freedom struggle.

On December 1946, Pandit Jawaharlal Nehru moved the 'Historic Objectives Resolution' in the Assembly. This laid the fundamentals and philosophy of the constitutional Structure. The Constitution of India, in its present form, was adopted, enacted and given by the people of India to themselves on November 26, 1949. The Constitution of India at the date of adoption Contained a preamble, 395 Articles and 8 Schedules. Over the years the Constitution of India had undergone substantial changes particularly by 7th, 42nd, 44th, 73rd, 74th and 97th Amendments. The 42nd Amendment to the

constitution in 1976 is itself called a 'Mini Constitution'. At present the Constitution of India holds 448 Articles in 25 parts and 12 Schedules.

The Constitution of India is not original in its content, it has been derived from various sources and constitution of the world. For example - The structural form of the constitution has been drawn from the Government of India Act 1935, the Philosophical part (the Fundamental Rights and Directive Principles of State Policy) From American and Irish Constitution and the political form the British Constitution.

The Constitution of India is unique in its content and spirit. Though borrowed from various sources, it has certain salient features. The salient features of the constitution of India includes - Lengthiest written Constitution, federal system with unitary bias, parliamentary form of Government, interated judiciary etc.

The Constitution of India, though adopted on the 26th day of November 1949, it was finally brought into effect on and from 26th day of January, 1950, the day chosen by Lahore session of Congress as the 'Poorna Swaraj day'.

The Constitution of India is a gift by the people of India to the people of India. On August 1947, a Drafting Committee was set up by the Constitution Assembly under the Chairmanship of Dr. B.R Ambedkar to prepare the final draft of the Constitution.

Dr. B.R Ambedkar prepared the final draft of the Constitution of India focussing

on three objectives EQUALITY LIBERTY and FRATERNITY - the foundation of the Indian Constitution.

In the famous words of Mahatma Gandhi ji, 'The best way to find yourself, is to lose yourself in the service of other' and Dr. Ambedhkar is the sole personification of this quote.

Popularly known as Baba Saheb Dr. B.R Ambedhkar was an eminent jurist and Economist. He was born in Mhow in present day Madhyapradesh. Born in a caste that was considered to be untouchable, he had to face many injustices and discriminations. He established the Habhistrit Sabha for bringing improvement in the socio economic lives of dalits. He led the Temple Entry Movement in 1930 in Nasik, Maharashtra for the entry of dalits in the Temples.

Dr. Ambedhkar also attempted for the establishment of seprate electorates for 'Depressed clases' which was instrumental during the second Round Table Conference in 1931. However, the plan of separate electorote for 'Depressed Clases' broke down in the form of Poona pact in 1932.

As an Economist, Dr. Ambedhkar advocated for a stable rupee.

Dr. Ambedhkar established the Independent labour party in 1936. After Independenle, he became the first Law Minister of the Country.

Dr. Ambedhkar died on April 14, 1956 due to illness and since then his birth anniversary is celebrated as 'Ambedhkar Jayanthi'. ●

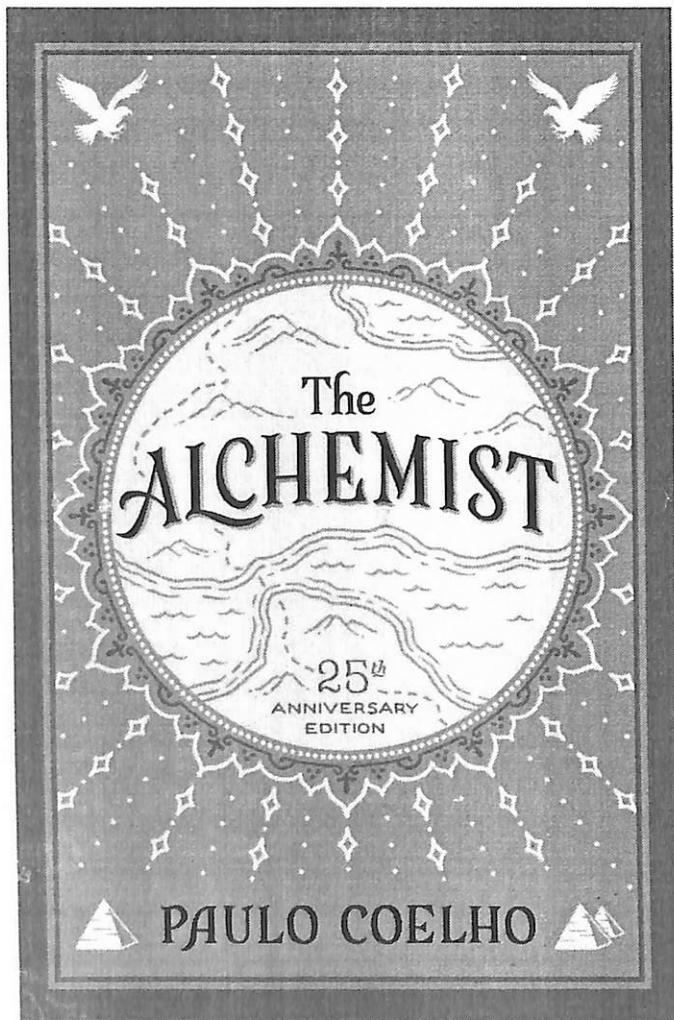

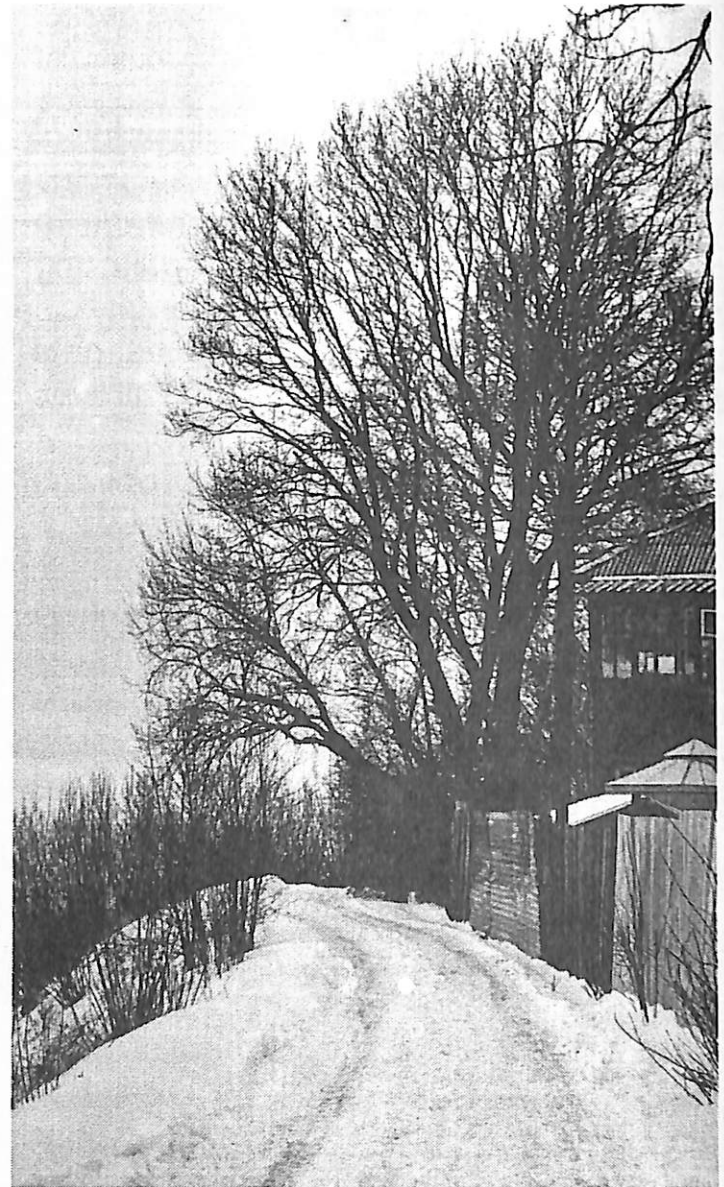

\* Reasons of important to Mother Tongue.

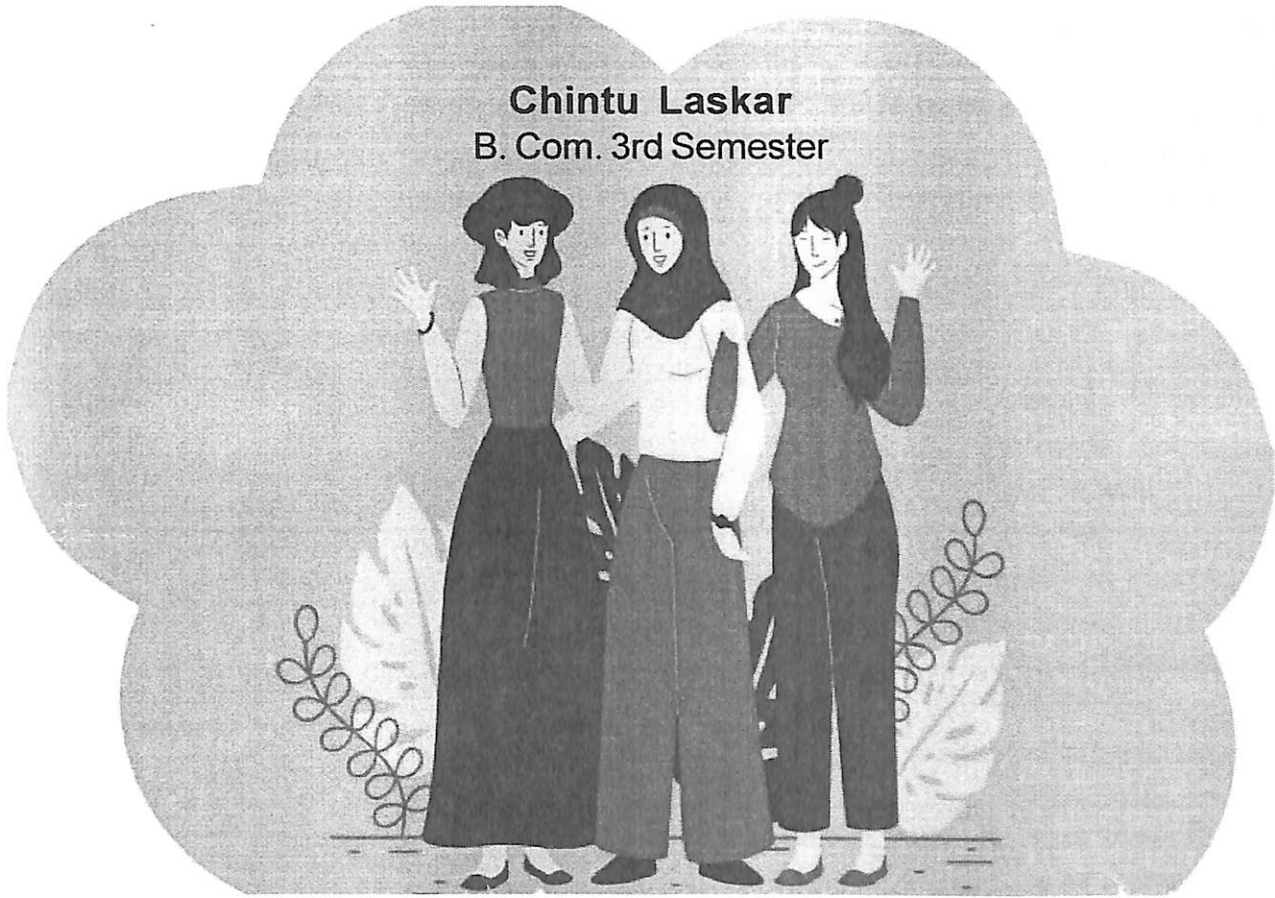
(1) Intellectual Development - Studies have shown that cognitive development as well as intellectual improvement is relatively faster in those who are fluent in their mother tongue.

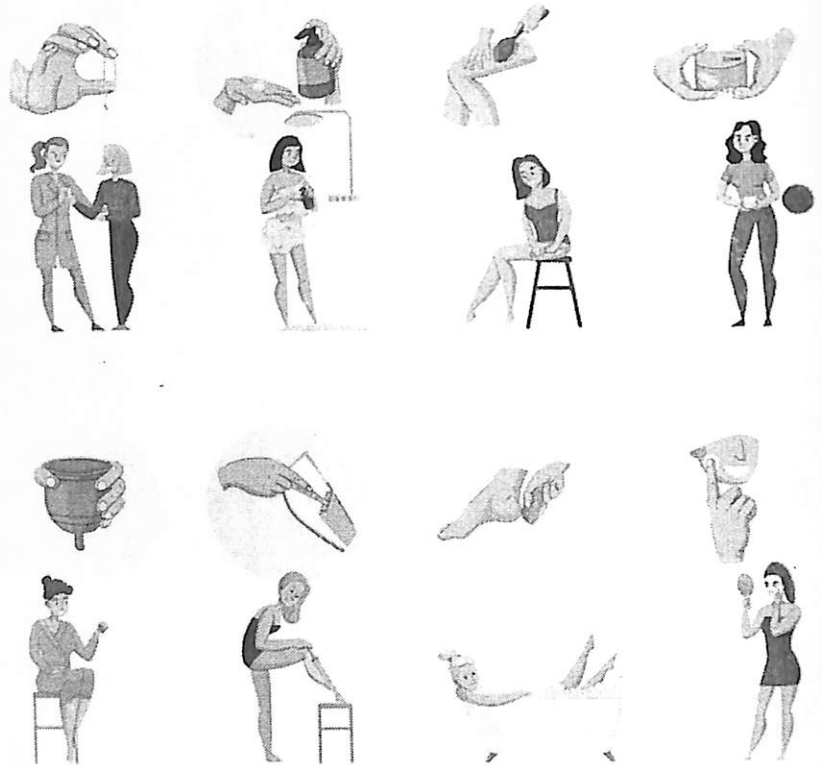

But one community is there who are being continuously deprived of in fulfilling or can't take basic healthy needs and related hygiene's, i.e. Woman, yes woman aren't concerned about their health matters in sometime who live a busy life or don't have time needed to stay on top of their health. But in our society one section of woman is also there who are failed or can't take much care about their health due to so many social, economic, family issues or pressures, culture beliefs and superstitions.

Issues & challenges relating to woman health : Everyday nearly 830 women died because of pre-age pregnancy. Women are oppressed to give birth of child to many numbers which adversely affects an womens health and create many hurdles in the overall development of a women. Woman health, has become a major concern in India because as per Global Gender Report, 2020, it benchmarks India at 108th position, In 2020, as per the Global Gender Gap Index, India was its 112th position, as the number of countries increased to 153, India's score has increased from 0.665 in 2018, to 0.668 to 2020 due to many reasons ranging from sanitation hygiene, - health and social stigma which directly affects health due to which she can't participate in the economical development of country.

Due to reproductive and sexual health, women are having more serious chronic non reproductive issues such as cardiovascular disease, "cancer diseases, mental illness, diabetics, and osteoporosis, hypertension, breast cancer, ovarian cancer, cervical cancer, gynecological disorders, pregnancy issues, malnutrition and marbity, HIV or AIDS etc.

If we go on data, over 70% of world cancer cases are coming from development countries with a fifty of those is from India, 40% of worlds cases on HIV or

AIDS are coming from India. There are more increasing infection in many location of India. The factor of malnutrition arises dire to special selection of gender class of food resource distribution. More than 66% women who are from non pregnant group are become anemic due to iron deficiency.



There are many aspects on women's health which needs to properly address off properly.

**Women hygiene and it's issues as well as challenges**

Like women's health women hygiene has become a very challenging and developmental issue ancongst all the issues related to women. In most of the countries, women are & not getting adequate facilities to fulfill basic health hygiene related to



their menstrual health. They are oppressed not to practice their menstrual health management in an effective way. Lack of adequate information regarding menstrual hygiene in most of places like schools, workplace or health centre to facilitate awareness amongst the people.

According to study by UNICEF conducted in 2011, over 13% girls are not aware their menstrual hygiene, 60% of those leave schools on account of menstrual problems, 44% of those are humiliated over restriction. In India, according to National Health and Family Welfare survey, 18% of women menstrual hygiene i.e. sanitary pads or napkins. But supremely on a Global level, over 500 millions girls give lack of adequate facilities on the menstrual hygiene.

#### Govt. Initiatives regarding Women health care and hygiene

The state govt. and central govt. including various organizations are promoting many schemes, campaigning



regarding awareness among people on women's health and hygiene. There are many movies which promoting women's

healthy sanitation and hygiene amongst the people to make them aware what should the society do for a woman and how a woman can practice best healthy hygiene to keep their health safe and sound for a longer time without having any issues. Movies like PADMAN, creating awareness by spurring conversations in various places. Various ads are prepared to make women aware, various central Govt. Schemes like RTE = 2009, Ujjwala, SABLA and MDWS, 401 schemes for promoting and selling the sanitary pads at free of cost or subsidized rates. Assam Govt. has sanctioned yearly stipend of Rs. 2600 to each girl coming from EWS background. Odisha Govt. give free sanitary napkins to students studying in Class 6 to 12. Every year on 28th May. Menstrual Hygiene day is celebrated to create awareness.

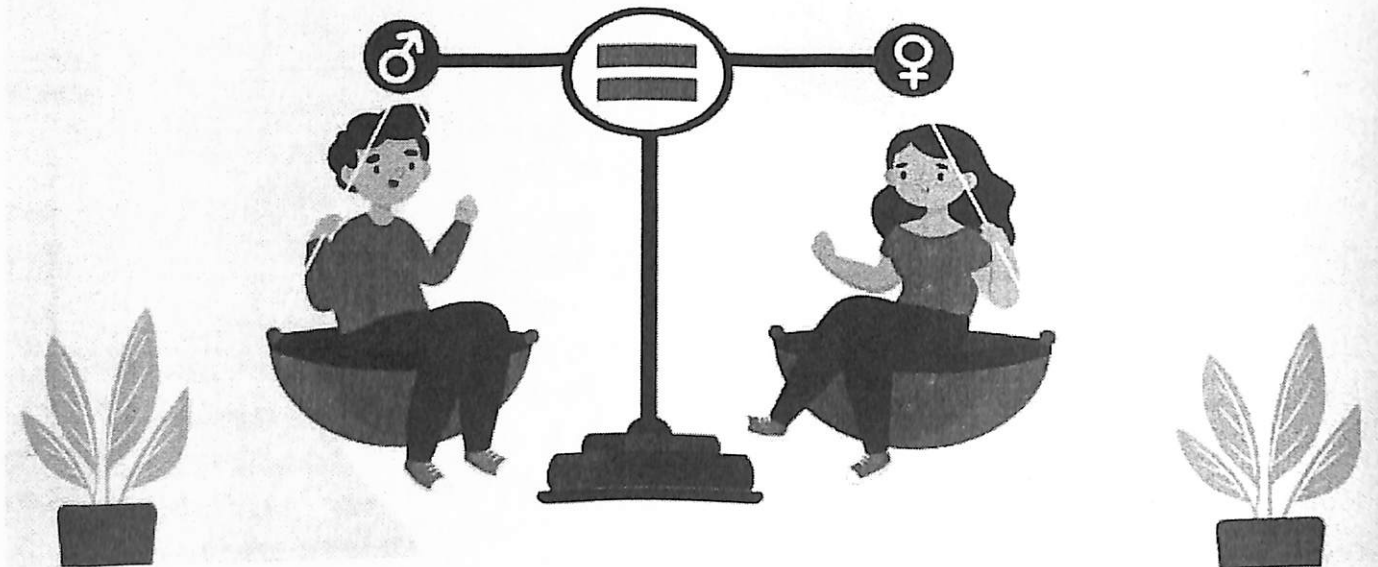
**CONCLUSION:** The safety of women should be our priority in terms of health and hygiene we should make more everyone regarding healthy hygiene of menstrual health.

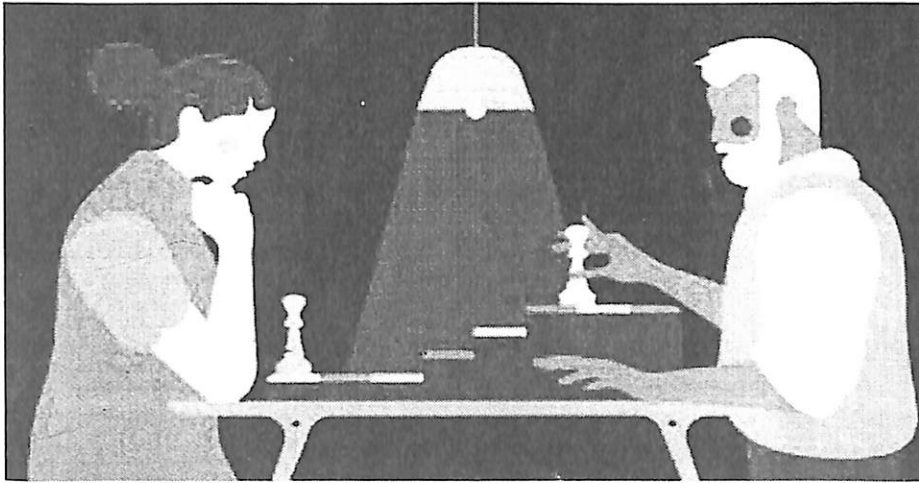
Many measures concerning gender equality interplay with the economy and more specifically with the work force.

disadvantage due to social, cultural problems which directly influence their health and which impede their health in access to health care and information.

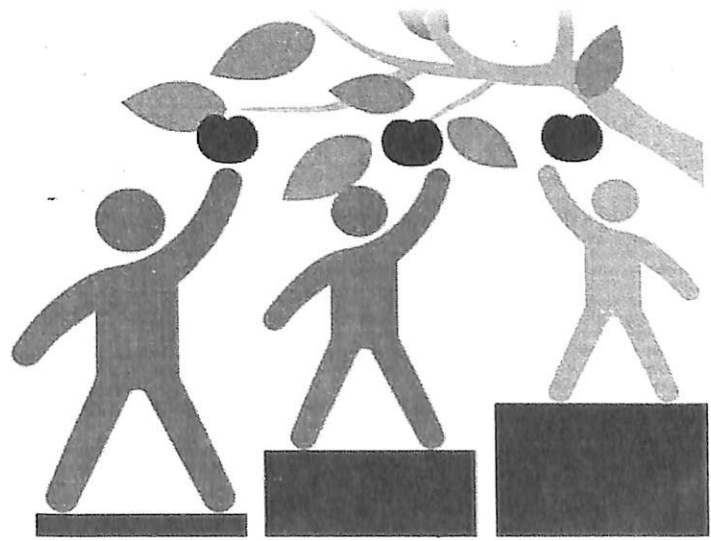
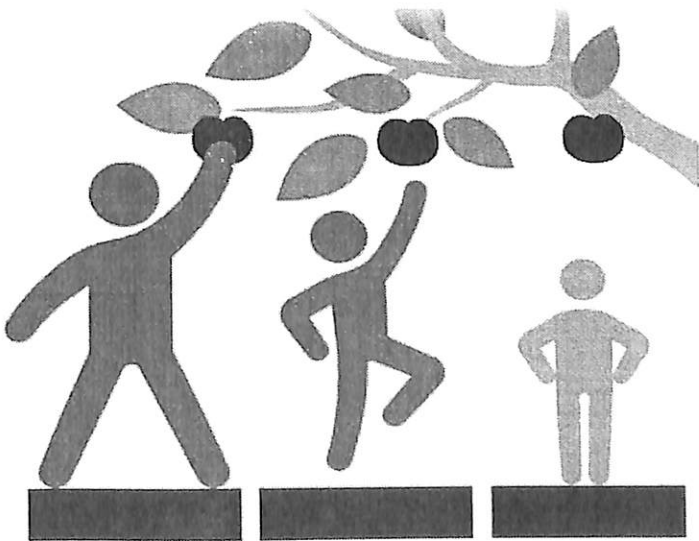

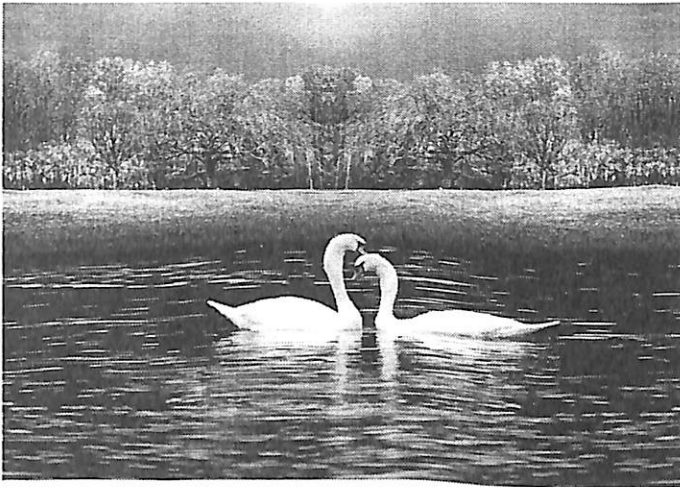
of mind. People should understand that women and nature both are equally important for their livelihood. But the generation today are some how losing it. They give less- importance to our 'Mother Earth'.

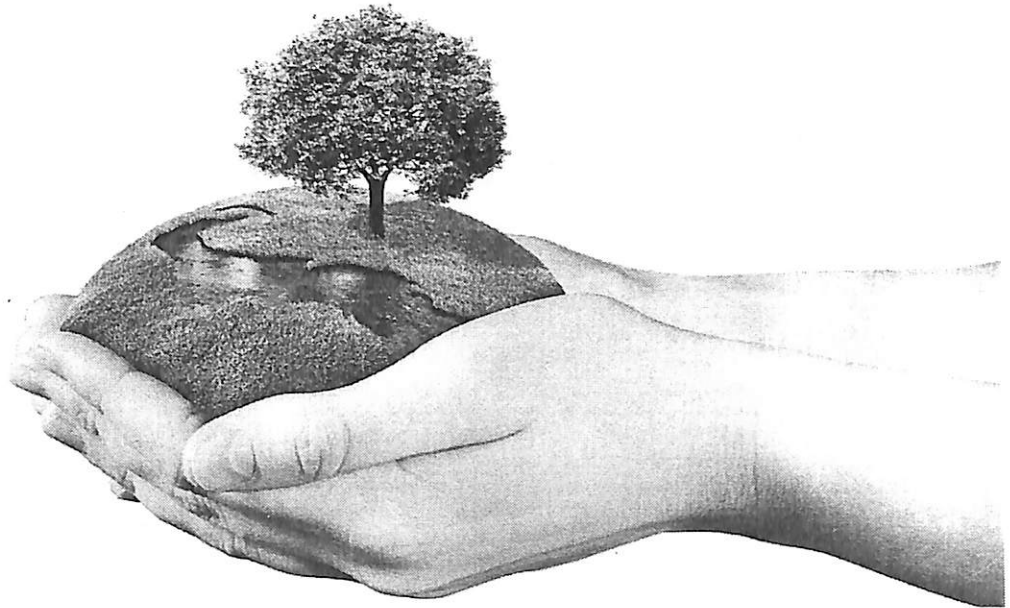

used to left her husband were not accepted by the society and not treated property. Even the attempted suicide after being ostracized by the villagers.

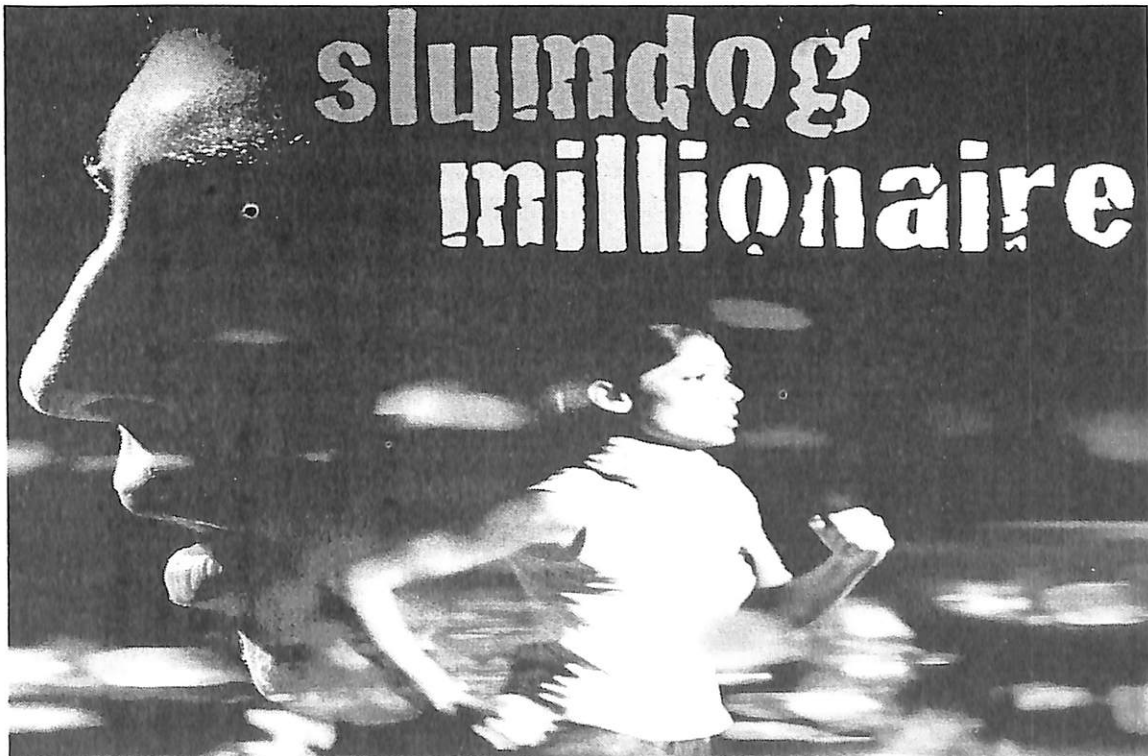
Kalpana Saraj is a very strong and determined lady. Although after faring lots of shunning from the people, the never gave up.

To conclude, people should be free from such hurdles and by sharing their views they build up their personality in a fruitful way.

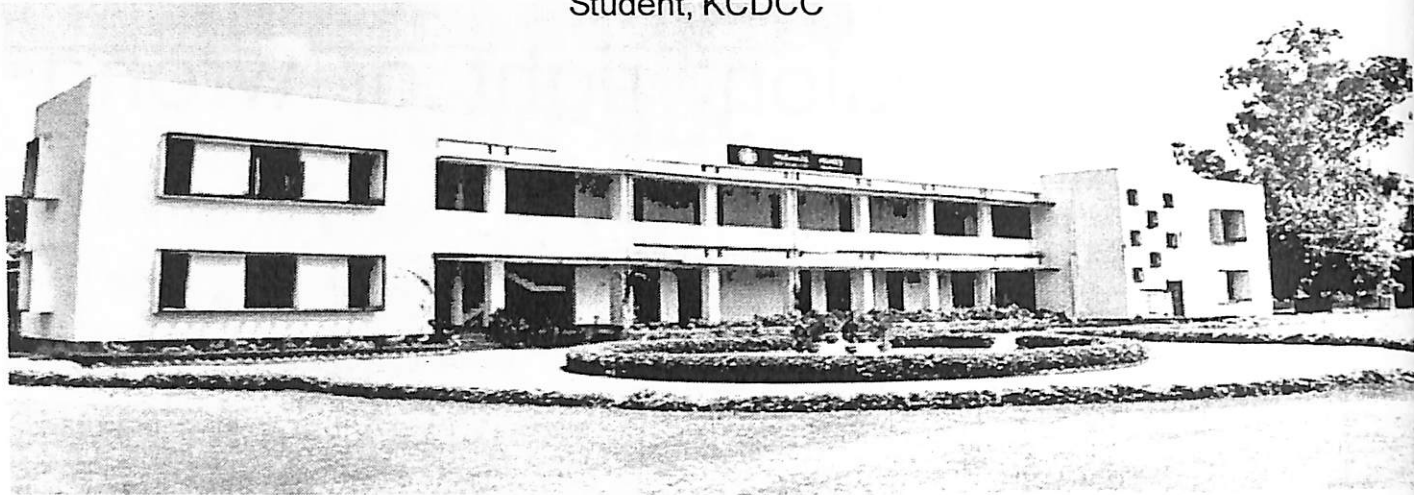

# MY LOCKDOWN STORY

It was a bright sunny day on 5th March, 2020. Our HS examination had just ended on that day and our excitement was on the top of the world. I was planning for a short trip to Shillong with 2 of my batchmates not knowing about the pandemonium that had broken out in the whole world. The name of the peril was Covid-19 or Corona or SARS-CoV-2. On January 27, the first case of Corona virus was registered in India. It was a 27-year-old female from Kerala who had developed some symptoms which doctors told was that of an ordinary viral fever. The patient had travel history from Wuhan, China, where it is considered to have originated. Soon India as well as the world got to know that it was no ordinary fever and no regular outbreak when the World Health Organisation (WHO) on 11th March, 2020, had declared the novel coronavirus outbreak a global pandemic (i.e., the virus had spread in every corner of the globe) which later went on to take life of over 25 lakh people and infect over 1 crore people and the countdown is still on. Very soon the virus had reached Guwahati, Assam, where I was studying. Due to some random reason, we halted all our plans and by that time the situation had only worsened as the number of cases mushroomed exponentially and there was no stop.

Monitoring the situation, we decided to call off our plan and continue with it when the situation would normalise. Being little downhearted but with strong faith that things would be normal very soon, I started packing my luggage to return home which was at Kokrajhar. I was staying with my mother in a rented house in Guwahati. All my friends left for their home but I decided to overstay as I had an appointment with my dentist, I clearly remember the date 23rd March when my braces were about to be put off. That put a tincture of happiness in me because I would be seeing the final result of one and half year long treatment. But fate had some different plan for me because just a day before my appointment date, our honourable prime minister had announced Janata curfew on TV. I had very little hope that situation would revive any time soon. Later when it was added that the nation would have to undergo 21 days lockdown and everyone had to quarantine themselves at their home, it just blew my mind. The only thing I had in my mind was that I had to reach home by hook or by crook putting rest of my plans aside. Unfortunately, we were left stranded in Guwahati as we couldn't arrange transportation even when we tried our level best. The circumstance was such that even the basic human activities were put on halt

not only in our place but all over the nation. Our next biggest concern was how to collect all essential items as all the shops were getting closed and we literally had no stock of groceries whereas all our neighbours had already stockpiled the essentials at their home. It was really a worrisome situation for us however, we managed to gather few items which help us sustain for a week. On 23rd March my sister also arrived from Kolkata where she was taking coaching classes for her PG in medical studies. She was quite lucky to have finished her MBBS because had she been a final year student or an internee, she would have to render medical services in Covid centres which would put my mother in undue stress. Before coming to Guwahati, she was feeling little feverish and it was another headache for us. However, she managed to come home safely. We had rented the house till March but as we couldn't move anywhere, we couldn't but had to extend our rent agreement. We had to stay in Guwahati for two more weeks and finally reached Kokrajhar on 1st week of April when my father somehow fixed a transportation for us on special permit. We had left the furniture, refrigerator and all other big items back in our rented house and kept it locked and only after 21 days lockdown was over, we were able to bring those remaining items home. After I reached Kokrajhar I started preparing hard for few competitive entrance exams like IPMAT, CUET, etc as I had nothing else to do then. Sitting at home all the day bored me to death because I have always been an outdoorsman, a naturalist,

a sports enthusiast. So, the only thing I could do was to work on my fitness staying indoors and that was probably was the most amazing part of my lockdown experience i.e., pushing yourself to break your boundaries. My immune system got boosted for this, I started losing fat although I have always been a slim person and gain a bit of muscle mass, I gained a different level confidence within me and a lot of petty positive changes that I evidenced. Apart from this we have made some wonderful memories like sneaking out and visiting friend's house by navigating through narrow lanes so that the police didn't notice us, hanging around with a bunch of friends during night time to lessen the visibility and many more. Along with these pleasant experiences my family had to go through a worse phase during the corona period and all the bad things seemed to have happened at once when my father became Covid-19 positive, my maternal aunt who resided at Karimganj succumbed to Corona and subsequently my maternal grandmother too passed away for the same reason. Not only this but many of our dear ones died of Corona. My mother went into state of resentment as she couldn't see her sister mother for the last time. My uncle was left alone as two of the family members all on a sudden got disappeared. This put our family in a worry especially my mother because there was no one to take care of my maternal sister. My sister had to return to Kolkata for her entrance examination even when the cases were at rise. Despite all these we somehow got through this worse phase. Nevertheless, life is a concoction of good and bad things and this is how life goes. ●



# Glass Ceiling

The term “Glass Ceiling” usually implies to the unseen existing barriers that prevents a person from being promoted to managerial- and executive-level positions within an organization or industry. This concept usually has a significant negative impact in the growth and development of a person. In this article, we have used the concept of glass ceiling with reference to women. This term was first used by Marilyn Loden during a 1978 speech. This concept was later popularized in a 1986 Wall Street Journal article

discussing the corporate hierarchy and how invisible barriers seemed to prevent women from advancing in their careers past a certain level.

## History

The U.S. Department of Labor launched the Glass Ceiling Commission in 1991 in response to the growing concern over barriers preventing women and minorities from advancing. It was charged with identifying the barriers that exist and policies that companies adopted or could undertake

to increase diversity at managerial and executive levels.

### **Change in the concept**

Ten years before the number of top women earners were lower as compared to today. The number of dismissals of women from job were twice more than that of today. Further, even after doing similar work as that of a male worker, females were paid less in comparison to the co- male workers. This concept is, though prevalent in some areas, but gradually this concept has been changing. Today, the women are encouraged to participate in any of the field which they prefer, whether it is a governmental organization, non-governmental organisation, private organisation or whatever field it is. Women are far more capable than men in various fields of work. If talking about this aspect, we can take the examples of some of the famous female persons who broke the concept of glass ceiling.

### **Examples of Some Persons who broke the concept of Glass Ceiling**

a) Hillary Clinton ran for president in 2008 and 2016, she repeatedly spoke of her goal of shattering the "highest, hardest glass ceiling" by becoming America's first female president.

b) Vice President Kamala Harris shattered the second-highest glass ceiling in the U.S. when she became the first female and first Black and South Asian Vice President on Jan. 20, 2021. She was also the first woman and first Black and South Asian attorney general of California, as well

as the first Black woman to be elected district attorney of San Francisco.

c) Janet Yellen became the first female Treasury secretary after being nominated by President Biden and sworn in on Jan. 26, 2021. She also served as the first woman to head the Federal Reserve, a role she held during President Barack Obama's administration.

d) As of Assam, Hima Das, the athlete who holds the current Indian national record in 400 meters with a timing of 50.79 s that she clocked at the 2018 Asian Games in Jakarta, Indonesia. She is the first Indian athlete to win a gold medal in a track event at the IAAF World U20 Championships. Due to her performance, Assam Government offered her the post of DSP in Assam Police. She proved that a female can achieve the greatest heights if given the opportunity to do so. By breaking the concept of glass ceiling, she is an inspiration for the other female youths.

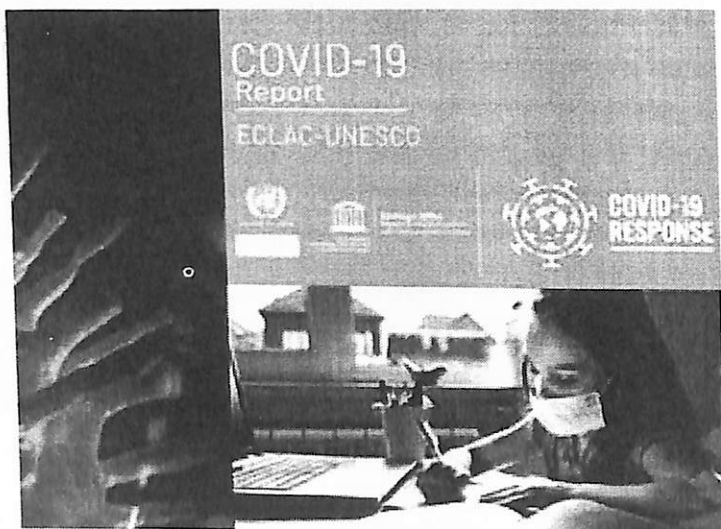

2. Students one year away from school or college - leaving exams:

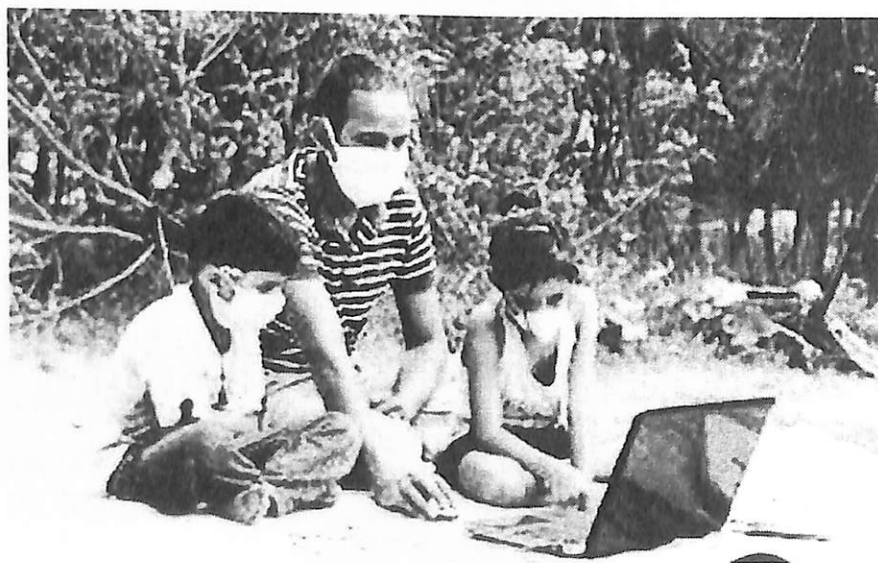

All emphasis was laid on head development while the heart of humanity was allowed to starve. It is this over-development of the head at the expense of the heart that has gone a long way to supply the psychological basis for our modern troubles. If there had been a balanced progress of the head and heart, human nature would have developed certain fundamental moral values, which would have made it impossible for the present world muddle to come about. It is therefore, necessary that the heart

development of the pupil should receive great attention at the hands of the educationalists. A great Chinese proverb says, "If you have two loaves, sell one and buy a lily". The implication is obvious. Do not concentrate your attention on only food and drink, but pay equal attention to the development of your aesthetic nature.

The greatness or littleness of the nation in the future is to a very large extent, dependent on how the youth of today are trained. In the first place, they have to become cultured citizens; they must help our nations to express the best in her, along her own lines and consistently with her special genius. The second idea at the back of an educational system properly organized must be to help the citizen to express himself as a unit of the nation to which he belongs. Each nation has a soul of its own which tries to express itself in several modes of thought and activity, and we are all, in one sense, only cells in that bigger organism. The standard culture of an eastern nation differs, in several essential points, from that of a western nation. And so in art there is a great national art peculiar to India. There are some special features about Indian Classical dance, which distinguish it from other dances of the world. 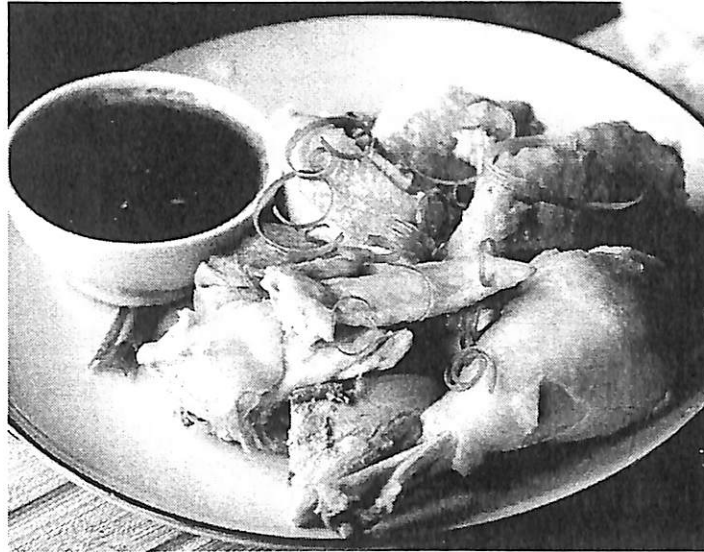

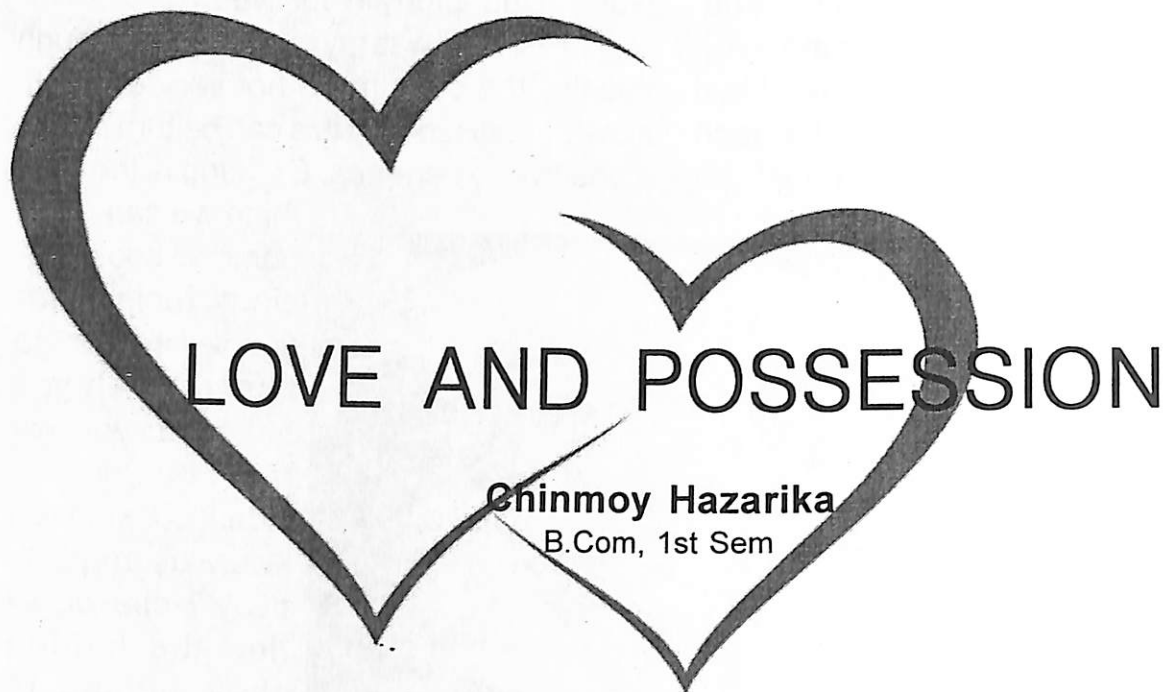

No free overnight has the most beautiful fruits & flowers & neither can a relationship, it takes time. Because remember, you can't eat the fruit at the same day you plant the seed.

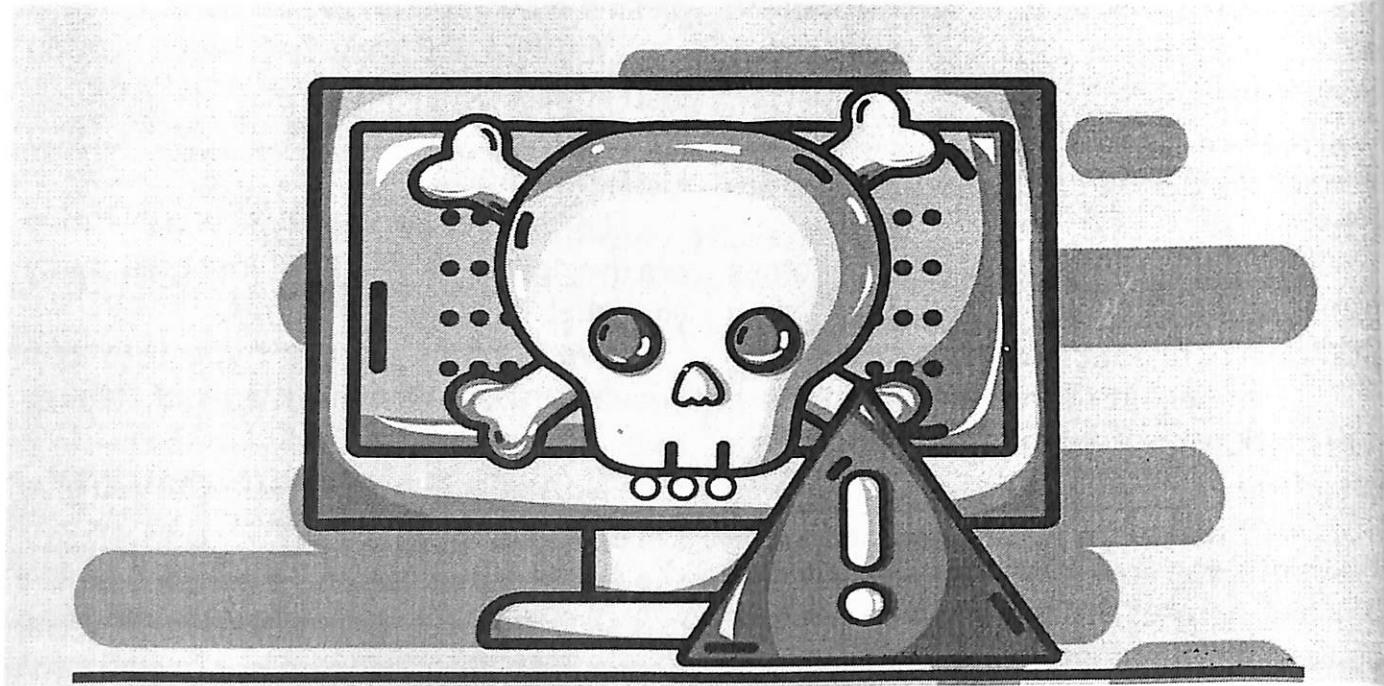

it's glory stands for period of change

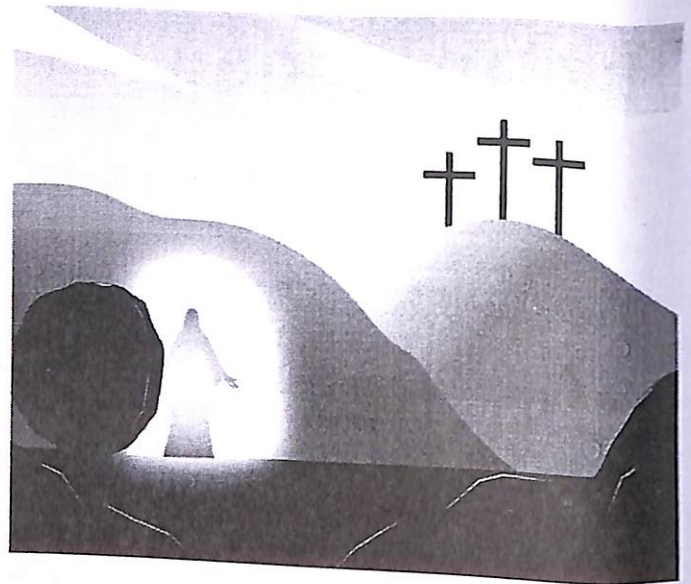
