

PROSPECTUS

K.C. Das Commerce College, Guwahati is a renowned centre of learning in the North East. It was established on the 7th day of November, 1983. The college has been named in the cherised memory of Late Keshab Chandra Das, an educationist of repute who was Inspector of Schools, Assam. Initially the college started in the evening shift with one hundred and seven students in the premises of Sonaram H.S. and M.P. School, Bharalumukh, Guwahati. On 30th November, 1994 the college was shifted to its permanent site at Chatribari (Near the Guwahati Gosala), Guwahati-781008.

The College is under deficit-grants-inaid system since 1998. At present it is imparting education to more than eighteen hundred students with an efficient and dedicated teaching staff. More than nine hundred students enrol annually and receive education upto degree major standard.

01. ADMISSION REQUIREMENT:

(A) For Higher Secondary (Two year) Course:

To be eligible for admission into first year class of Higher Secondary Courses of Commerce a student has to pass H.S.L.C Examination of SEBA or any other equivalent examination recognised by the Assam Higher Secondary Education Council (AHSEC).

(B) For B.Com. (Three year Degree) Course :

To be eligible for admission into first year of B.Com. a student has to pass the-

(i) Pre-University/Pre-Degree/Higher Secondary Examination in Commerce or equivalent examintaion in Commerce.

Or

(ii) P.U./P.D./H.S. Examination in Arts with Book Keeping and Accountancy (BKA) and Business Organisation and Commercial Parctice (BOCP).

Or

(iii) PU./P.D/H.S. Examination in Science and Arts provided BKA and BOCP papers are cleared in the First Year and Final Year H.S. Examination of the AHSEC before appearing the B.Com. Part-I Examination.

02. MIGRATION AND ELIGIBILITY CERTIFICATE:

Students from Boards or University other than the SEBA, AHSEC and Gauhati University shall have to produce Migration Certificate at the time of admission. They must also obtain Eligibility Certificate from the AHSEC and G.U. for admission by paying a fee of Rs. 100/- and Rs. 190/-respectively.

03. ADMISSION PROCEDURES:

Application for admission into the college should be made in the prescribed application form issued by the college office on payment of Rs. 40/-.

Admission to the H.S. Course is held after the announcement of H.S.L.C. Examination result and to the B.Com. Course after H.S. Final Examination result.

The dates of admission to various classes are notified in local newspaper and the College Notice Board.

Admission to the college is made strictly in order of merit and is governed by college admission rules. There is reservation for SC, ST, OBC/MOBC, physically handicapped students and for students having extra curricular activities as follows:

All admission made to the college are provisional and subject to the approval of the AHSEC/GU. The college is not responsible if the AHSEC/GU does not approve admission of any student on ground of lack of Migration Certificate/Eligibility Certificate or for furnishing wrong or false documents and statements. Students shall have to produce original Marksheet, Certificates etc, at the time of admission. Attested copies of the same are to be attached with the application forms.

05. SELECTION OF MAJOR SUBJECT:

A student opting for major shall be selected on the basis of merit. A deserving student will be given major subject according to his/her preference and shall not be allowed to change the subject thereafter.

Note: If a student fails to get 40% in the major papers in the Annual Examination/Unit Test of T.D.C. 1st year then his/her major will be cancelled in the T.D.C. 2nd year class.

06. REQUIREMENT OF PASS MARKS-B.COM. PART-I AND B.COM. PART-II FINAL EXAMINATIONS. (Part-I Examination)

In order to pass the B.Com Part-I Examination (General or Major Course) a candidate must obtain the minimum marks as shown below.

In order to pass in group B.C.D.E. a candidate must obtain at least 33% marks in aggregate of these groups. Thus the minimum total marks required to be obtained in order to pass the examination is 324.

07. CLASSIFICATION OF RESULTS:

A) A candidate who passes both the part-I and part-II B.Com. Examinations shall be deemed to have passed the B.Com. Examination as a whole and shall be eligible for the degree of Bachelor of Commerce (B.Com.)

B) In the case of candidates of General Course, the total marks counted will be 1,400 (1000 + 400) marks and the result will be declared as follows:

i) Those securing 840 and above I Division ii) Those securing 560-839 II Division

iii) Those securing 456-559 Simple Pass.

C) In the case of candidates having Major, the total marks counted will be 1200 marks (600 marks of C,D,E, groups of Part-I examination + 600 marks of Part-II examination and the result will be declared as follows:

i) Those securing 720 or above I Class.

ii) Those securing 480-719 II Class.

ii) Those securing 396-479 Simple Pass.

08. RULES FOR REPETITION OF PAPER OF PART-I EXAMINATION.

(Only for students having Major):

Successful students of B.Com. (TDC) Part-I Examination with Major Course subject, may be allowed to repeat any one of the papers of Group-C,D,E, of Part-I Course in order to improve their performance in the Major Subject in the next Part-I examination. Such a candidate shall be eligible to sit simultaneously for the repeat paper along with the Part-II examination. In the interest of the students the better of the two marks secured in the paper concerned shall be considered for declaration of their B.Com(TDC) Part-I result.

Such candidates shall be required to fill in prescribed forms and pay the prescribed fees.

Any candidate having arrear in any subject (s) shall not be eligible for repeating any paper for the purpose of improvement of result.

09. ACADEMIC SESSION:

The Academic Session starts in June and ends in May next year.

10. COLLEGE HOUR:

The college hour is from 10 A.M. to 4 P.M.

11. COLLEGE UNIFORM:

From session 2000-2001 the college has introduced compulsory uniform for the students as follows:

For boys— White shirt and dark navy blue long pants.

Maroon sweater/Blazer (in winter).

For girls— White Mekhla-Chaddar or Saree with dark navy blue border and dark navy Blue blouse/White

Salwar or Churidar, white dupatta and kameez with small dark navy blue and white checks. Maroon sweater (in winter).

- Note: -(i) T-Shirts and Jackets will not be allowed.
 - (ii) Students must be in their uniform during-
 - (a) Freshers social of the college.
 - (b) Foundation Day of the college.
 - (c) Open session and meeting of the College Week' function of the college.
 - (iii) In the rest of the days of the 'College Week' function students may wear dresses other than the college uniform.
 - (iv) Other dresses will also be allowed during the Summer and Puja vacations.

12. CLASS ATTENDANCE:

A student is expected to attend atleast 65% of the total lectures delivered.

- (a) Students of T.D.C. and H.S. classes attending less than 65% but more than 50% of the classes shall be treated as "Non-Collegiate" and will be liable to pay fine of Rs. 65.00 (Sixty five only) & Rs 30/- (Thirty only) respectively.
- (b) Students attending less than 50% but more that 25% of the classes will be considered and allowed to appear in the examination provided he/she pays a fine of Rs. 1000/-(One thousand).
- (c) Students attending less that 25% of the total classes will be declared as "Discollegiate" and will not be allowed to appear in the Annual/Final Examinations.

13. RULES REGARDING COLLEGE INTERNAL EXAM.

a) Unit Tests:

The college conducts an 'Unit Test Examination' instead of peparatory or test or annual examination. There will be two unit test examinations for H.S. 1st year, H.S.2nd year, TDC 2nd year and TDC 3rd year. The students of TDC 1st year will have to sit for the 3rd unit test examination.

b) Major Subjects:

Students who takes major in TDC are entitled to go for field work. 20% of the marks will be alloted for field work.

IMPORTANT NOTE

- No student will be promoted to the next higher class or allowed to appear in the final examination if he/she is unable to secure 30% marks in aggreate in the Unit Tests of the College.
- No student will be promoted to the next higher class on medical ground.
- H.S. first Year Examination is conducted by Assam Higher Secondary Education Council.

14. SCHOLARSHIPS:

- National Scholarship (All India basis)
- 2. State Merit Scholarship.
- 3. Schedule Cast/Schedule Tribe Scholarship.
- 4. OBC/MOBC/Ex-Tea Garden Labour Scholarship.

The above scholarship are granted by the Government for which application forms of eligible students are forwarded to the respective authorities for consideration. After the sanction of scholarship, money will be deposited into individual account.

15. COLLEGE LIBRARY:

The college library is small in size but it has a good collection of selected books and journals. There is also a reading room in the library.

16. COLLEGE MAGAZINE:

The "K.C. Das Commerce College Magazine" is published annually. The magazine gives an opportunity to the

students to express their creativity in different fields. The magazine is run by an "Editorial Board" formed by the Principal.

17. STUDENTS' WELFARE FUND:

On application to the Principal an amount not exceeding the annual tuition fees, is granted to the needy students, whose father's/guardian's annual income does not exceed Rs. 3600/- p.a. (Rupees three thousand and Six hundred only).

18. STUDENT'S TRAVEL CONCESSION:

Students are entitled to Students Travel Concession on their way home from the institution and back during the vacation only. Air concession is also allowed.

19. IDENTITY CARD:

An identity card is issued to every student to be possessed by them during the college hours.

20. PROCEDURE OF FORMATION OF STUDENTS' UNION:

The returning officer of the Election Committee will invite application from the interested student for the post of Students' Union for the session. There will be a "Selection Committee" which will conduct an interview to select the members of the Students' Union.

Note: A student will be eligible to apply for any post of the Students' Union provided he/she have at least 25% class attendance of the total lectures delivered on the date of noticification.

21. CASUAL ADMISSION:

Admission for casual students will start from 1st of Oct 2002 to 10th of Oct 2002.

22. INSTRUCTION REGARDING COLLEGE RULES AND DISCIPLINE:

- Great emphasis is laid on discipline and character building and students are expected to maintain a higher standard of discipline in and outside the college campus. They are subject to the rules and regulations of the college.
- ii. The students admitted to the college must abide by all rules and regulations as prescribed by the college authorities. Violation of rules, unsatisfactory progress, irregular attendance, showing discourtesy to the teachers and staff members in any form, adoption of unfair means during examination etc. are some of the offences which may make students liable for disciplinary action like termination of scholarship, forced transfer and even expulsion from the college.
- iii. Smoking & Chewing Pan-Masala etc. in the college campus will be treated as one of the major indisciplines of the students.

All powers for maintaining discipline are vested with the Principal and his decision shall be final in all such matters.

- No student will be promoted to the next higher class or allowed to appear in the final examination if he/she is unable to secure 30% marks in aggreate in the Unit Tests of the College.
- Students attending less than 50% but more that 25% of the classes will be considered and allowed to appear in the examination provided he/she pays a fine of Rs. 1000/-(One thousand).
- Students attending less that 25% of the total classes will be declared as "Discollegiate" and will not be allowed to appear in the Annual/Final Examinations.
- College Uniform is strictly compulsory.
